

SIGNIFICANT 2019 CLIMATE LEGISLATION

H.51 & S.66 - A ban on new, large-scale fossil fuel infrastructure

H.91 & S.75 – Authorizes Vermont to join a multi-state carbon pricing program

H.423 – Effectively lifts the 500 kw net metering cap on towns and schools

H.462 – A Global Warming Solutions Act to make Vermont's climate goals requirements

H.463 - The Economy-Strengthening Strategic Energy eXchange (ESSEX) Plan

H.477 – A 10-year/\$1.6 billion plan to benefit equity, the economy and the environment

Upcoming "crossover" deadlines. March 15 is the date by which policy bills must leave their committee of origin to be considered for passage by both the House and Senate in 2019. Bills impacting revenue or carrying an appropriation must also move through the "money committees" by March 22.


Climate Action Plan for 2019 A BLUEPRINT FOR PROGRESS

- Double the number of low- and moderate income homes weatherized every year
- Create an electric or hybrid vehicle incentive program, prioritizing low- and middle-income
 Vermonters, starting by using VW settlement dollars
- Enact a Global Warming Solutions Act like other New England states to require progress on climate goals
- Analyze the JFO-led decarbonization study and advance the policy that works best for Vermont to reduce emissions, grow jobs and protect the most vulnerable


