More Whys

- Why did I think I could do this?
 - Very generous subsidies inserted into the federal tax regulations in 1992 to encourage PRIVATE investment in renewable energy
 - Typically yield full return of initial investment in 5 years
 - The ability to recycle the returned funds and do it again
 - For me, charity on steroids
- Why am I telling this story?
 - To encourage others of similar means and desires to consider such a project
 - To let you know that solar developers have begun actively facilitating this "local impact investor" model
