





VERMONT CLIMATE POLLUTION GOALS vs. ACTUALS




Vermont Greenhouse Gas Pollution Since 1990 (MMTC02e)

Dollars Spent on Fossil Fuels



Cap-and-Invest: Transportation & Climate Initiative (TCI)

- Regional collaboration to cap emissions from cars and trucks
- Proceeds to be invested in clean transportation alternatives
- Move boldly to accelerate investment impacts



Building Efficiency: Focus Job Training and Economic Development on Climate

- Include GHG metrics and awareness in all state training and licensure programs
- Make efficiency measurable
- Align workforce and climate
- Use Vermont building codes
