They need your help in their work providing non-critical, but essential social services to municipalities, organizations, and individuals in need, including but not limited to providing or securing food, shelter, information, medical supplies, transportation, volunteers, etc.

VNRC Launches New Lunchtime Webinar Series



The Vermont Natural Resource Council (VNRC) is launching a new lunchtime webinar series to discuss a broad range of environmental topics surrounding the state. The VNRC lunchtime series will look to host webinars with different experts from around the state. This upcoming Thursday, April

16th, VNRC's Executive Director Brian Shupe and Policy and Water Program Director Jon Groveman will provide updates on Act 250, Vermont's landmark environmental law. Future webinars will focus on issues ranging from climate issues, protecting our waterways, and how elections might be impacted by the social distancing measures in place. Burlington Launches "Green Stimulus Package"



In response to the Coronavirus, Mayor Miro Weinberg of Burlington announced that the city would be launching a "green stimulus package" to encourage environmentally friendly behavior when the city reopens after the shutdown. "We're not going to stop working on the climate emergency

even while we're battling COVID-19," Mayor Weinberg said during his regular afternoon update. "In fact, whenever possible, we're going to pursue strategies that advance our progress in both of these crises".

One company that is leading this initiative is the Burlington Electric Department (BED).

While BED already has in place measures to help with customer relief during this time, such as a suspension of late fees and disconnections, they are also seeking regulatory approval for a bevy of recovery programs. These programs include incentives for weatherization, coldclimate heat pumps, and electric vehicles as well as zero interest loans for nonprofits and small businesses for energy efficiency projects. Darren Springer, BED's General Manager, said at the press briefing, "The green stimulus package ... could provide a boost and particularly help our low- and moderate-income customers, help renters and homeowners, help small businesses and nonprofits be able to save energy, save money, and help reduce carbon emissions". Interesting Perspectives on the Need for a Green Investments



As we consider the economic implications of the COVID-19 pandemic, it is important that we ensure that our response to the COVID crisis sets us up to respond to the climate crisis as well. The ideas at the heart of green investments will be more important than ever as we seek to rebuild our economies in the

aftermath of this crisis. A recent op-ed in The Hill by former U.S Energy Secretary Ernest Moniz lays out the many benefits of green investments. Secretary Moniz writes that "we need to create new jobs, protect the livelihoods American people, and ensure the future resilience of our economy". He states that the best way to do this is to support the creation of clean energy jobs and to provide incentives for Americans to switch to renewable energy and save fuel use through home weatherization programs.

A recent article in *Rolling Stone* also illuminates the benefits of a switching to renewable energy through green investments. It states that "by 2050, this transition avoids \$3.1 trillion a year in climate damages ... and saving \$1.3 trillion a year for consumers over the fossil-fueled status quo".

Take Part in Earth Day EcoChallenge this April



The Earth Day EcoChallenge is a yearly event every April where people from across the globe come together to take action in saving our planet. For the month of April,

participants pledge to take action in any way they can to help build habits to create a healthier planet. This year is even more important as the EcoChallenge allows us to see how all of our actions make a large impact, even if we can not be around each other while we do it. To take part in the Earth Day EcoChallenge, register on their website as either an individual, as a group or as part of an already existing group. Once you register, you can choose which actions you take, which will give you points based on their impact. These actions can range from one time or daily tasks and you can even choose from categories such as wildlife, climate, food and more. Most of the actions have been tailored so that they can be done in quarantine. One of the larger groups in Vermont, the Upper Valley Climate Action 2020 team, already has 32 members who have scored over 1,800 points. UVM Extension Hosting Watershed and Aquatic Science Webinar Series



The University of Vermont Extension Lake Champlain Sea Grant Education Team is hosting an interactive webinar series focused on watershed and aquatic science. The webinar series, titled "Zoom a Scientist", is free to attend and will be held every Tuesday and Friday from noon to 1 p.m. All webinars will be recorded for later viewing.

The webinars span a wide range of topics from life cycles of fish, mapping of water basins to climate change's effect on Lake Champlain. While all the topics are interesting and in-depth, two webinars specifically focus on the effects climate change will have on Lake Champlain.

On April 17th, "Climate Change in the Lake Champlain Basin" will look at the effects climate change has already had on Lake Champlain and what future effects we might expect.

On April 28th, "Long-term Effects of Climate Change on Lakes and the Importance of Winter Sampling" will look at research already done on how climate change impacts lake metabolism during winter months. On Thursday, April 23rd from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. the "Storytelling Day: Tales of Fossil Fuel Resistance" will share stories from Vermonters about Vermont's gas pipeline resistance to Middlebury's successful Divest campaign.
