Exciting News on the Global Warming Solutions Act



Last week, the Vermont Senate overwhelmingly passed the Global Warming Solutions Act (GWSA) on a bipartisan vote of 23-5 in its final reading! This critical piece of climate legislation now returns to the House for needed action before heading to Governor Scott's desk. Learn more here.

See how your Senators voted on this bill by using VCV's online Environmental Scorecard. (Click on the Senator who corresponds to your district. Their GWSA vote will appear first on their list of votes. And, please THANK those Senators who stood up in support of an equitable, clean energy economy.)

GWSA will require Vermont to meet its climate pollution reduction targets while mapping out a plan that aims to ensure our transition to clean energy is equitable, resilient, strengthens our economy, and supports sustainable farms and forests.

We've got a lot of ideas for how to encourage people to weatherize their homes (more on that below), but we really want to know what we could offer that would make you excited to participate. Energy Committees are the heart of the Button Up campaign and we want to build this around what you need. With those goals in mind, we are asking participating communities to:

- * Weekly "Weatherization Wednesday" online video series featuring trivia, Q&As, DIY-videos, and tips for weatherization in a short 20-30 minute blast every week throughout September-November.
- * To support the spirit of regional events, this year Regional Planning Commissions will be able to host custom Step Up to Button Up Webinars with special information for your communities. This is a great opportunity to combine forces and support an online activity for your neighbors in town and in surrounding communities.
- * Efficiency Vermont is offering Free *Virtual* Home Energy Visits to people across the state who are interested in learning how their home could benefit from weatherization. This year every Vermonter can access this offer, but as a participating community, you get resources to spread the word to your residents. There will also be plenty of support coming your way in terms of materials, marketing, and help explaining Efficiency Vermont incentives and DIY-project offers.
- * Support for low income weatherization needs, where individual communities can support Weatherization Agencies throughout Vermont. *Look out for more on this!*

Vermont Electric Co-op Doubles Incentives for Cold Climate Heat Pumps



The Vermont Electric Co-op (VEC) is doubling its bill credit incentive for customers for cold climate heat pumps from \$300 to \$600 per outdoor unit. VEC is also increasing its bill credit incentives for heat pump water heaters from \$150 to \$250. The incentives are available for purchases made on or after June 1st. Besides the credits for cold climate heat pumps and heat pump water heaters, VEC is also offering bill credits to customers who purchase electric vehicles, electric vehicle charging equipment, pellet stoves, electric forklifts, electric

lawn mowers, and even highly-efficient homes called Zero Energy Modular Homes, or ZEM Homes. Learn more about these opportunities on VEC's Energy Transformation incentives page or by calling 1-800-832-2667.
