Last week, Vermont legislators overrode Governor Phil Scott's veto of H.688 — the Global Warming Solutions Act. Now enacted, the law requires Vermont to create a planning process

and framework to ensure stepped, strategic action on climate change. It sets deadlines for the state to cut harmful climate pollution, with the 26 percent Paris Climate Accord reduction target as the first milestone and achieving net zero by 2050. The Solutions Act sets in place guideposts for how Vermont must meet these targets. It requires a focus on a just transition; reducing energy burdens and minimiz-

ing negative impacts on rural and marginalized communities, as well as rebuilding and growing the State's economy while protecting public health, enhancing community resilience and harnessing the power of the State's natural systems to store and capture carbon.

Fundamentally, the Solutions Act is an action framework. It will require state government to lead in the advancement and implementation of job-creating, pollution reducing climate solutions and, as a last remedy, create a venue for Vermonters to hold the State accountable through the courts if further action is needed to hit the targets. The State has 60 days to appoint members to a 23-member climate council that will serve as the lead entity to craft the required Climate Action Plan to achieve the targets. Massachusetts, Connecticut and, more recently, Maine are among the states that have a Solutions Act framework in place; a framework that has enabled them to make far more climate progress than Vermont to date. This new law sets the stage for Vermont, finally, to make much-needed, job-creating progress. Stay tuned for more information about the process and plans to ensure the success of this new framework! 
## Don't Miss Energy Action Network's Annual Summit on October 1st

## New MileageSmart Capstone Program Helps Low Income Earners Buy Their Next Car

mileagesmart ••••• Capstone Community Action has developed a program to subsidize the purchase of used efficient cars for income-eli-

gible Vermonters. This new program, called MileageSmart, is part of Capstone's climate justice work to support the dual goals of addressing social equity while fighting climate change. MileageSmart offers an incentive worth 25% of the purchase price, up to \$5,000. This program allows people to invest in a high-efficiency vehicle that will cut their monthly and longterm transportation costs and help reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

This is an exciting new program that you – or perhaps others you know! – can take advantage of to begin saving far more money at the pump with a high-efficiency car that gets more miles to the gallon. It's also a potential funding foundation to explore going electric, considering, fully-electric vehicles, while sometimes higher priced upfront, require less maintenance over their lifetime, resulting in even more long-term savings. This innovative program aims to make it easier for people to save money and reduce climate pollution by lowering the upfront cost of more efficient vehicles.
