Vermont Conservation Voters, VPIRG Votes, and the Vermont Sierra Club have all endorsed Lt. Governor David Zuckerman in his run for Governor. For years, these three groups have been advocating and fighting for clean air and water and healthy communities in Vermont. They know the ins and outs of statewide policy debates, the champions and leaders, and who's been putting in the important work - both at the podium and behind-thescenes.

New Harvard and Vermont Studies Show Clean Transportation Options Improve Public Health







Two recent studies show that transportation and energy policies are much more important to our health than we might think.

A new Harvard study shows that the Transportation Climate Initiative (TCI) plan to modernize transportation in Northeast & Mid-Atlantic states would yield up to \$11 billion in annual health benefits, reducing racial health disparities and avoiding up to 1,100 deaths and 4,700 childhood asthma cases. The report makes a case for investing in clean transportation solutions such as enhanced transit, safe and bikeable streets, and vehicle electrification, states in the region to not only experience lower greenhouse gas emissions, but also reduce local air pollution. A similar study by the Vermont Department of Health found that if we meet our transportation goals in Vermont's Comprehensive Energy Plan we could prevent 2,000 early deaths and save \$1.1 billion in health care costs and lost productivity. The study's health impacts were

based on changes in physical activity, air quality, and traffic safety. According to the study, the greatest benefits to health would come from more walking and biking. Vermonters spend nearly 500 minutes traveling via various forms of transportation each week, but only about 50 of those minutes are spent walking or biking. Vermont Health Commissioner Mark Levine, MD said a focus on reducing barriers to walking and biking will make it easier for people to make the healthier choice of physical activity. Zero Energy Now is Back!



The home energy retrofit program "Zero Energy Now" (ZEN) is back! Vermont homeowners can once again participate in a comprehensive energy retrofit program pro-

viding weatherization, efficient heating systems and renewables such as solar PV and advanced wood heating systems. The ZEN incentives make bringing your home to as close to zero energy even more possible (up \$5,000 depending on the energy saved, and an additional \$3,000 for low- to moderate-income homeowners). This program is first-come, first-serve, and contracts must be signed by December 31, 2020 so take advantage of this opportunity now.
