this challenging time — this moment offers a rare opportunity for meaningful investments in desperately needed money-saving, health-enhancing, pollution-reducing strategies. There is also the possibility of Congress passing a funding package focused on infrastructure and jobs soon. While exact guidance around how these federal dollars can be spent is still forthcoming, we wanted to make sure you are both aware of the possibilities and potential limitations around how these funds might be used. The Legislature is hard at work crafting a FY 2022 budget that outlines their initial plans for appropriating some — potentially not all — of the just-over \$1 billion American Rescue Plan dollars to many important programs that serve Vermonters and Vermont businesses. President Biden's Earth Day Commitment to Cut U.S. Climate Pollution In Half by 2030



On Earth Day, President Biden announced a new ambitious commitment to cut U.S. greenhouse gas emissions 50% below 2005 levels by 2030, positioning American workers and industry to tackle the climate crisis.

While climate pledges are important guides, our

experience in Vermont has taught us that it is policies in support of good promises that lead to durable progress. See this fact sheet for more context about the kinds of policies that could help make President Biden's climate pledge a reality.

With the passage of the Global Warming Solutions Act, which turned our state's climate goals into requirements, and the important work of the Climate Council to develop a Climate Action Plan, Vermont has a real opportunity to lead again and help Vermonters realize all the money-saving, health-enhancing and equity-improving benefits of this needed transition.
