Small Grants for Innovative Local Climate and Energy Projects Up to \$4,000!



The Vermont Council on Rural Development announced the launch of a new small grant program designed to support local innovators with projects that move Vermont closer to its climate and energy goals. The Climate Catalysts Innovation Fund is capitalized with \$20,000 from the Vermont Low Income Trust for Electricity (VLITE) and VSECU. This grant program is intended to support innovative local projects for which a small grant could have a meaningful impact.

Municipalities, schools, businesses, non-profit organizations, and town energy committees are all eligible to apply. Four to 10 grant awards will be made ranging in size from \$500 to a maximum of \$4,000.

The Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission (CCRPC) is seeking a person highly motivated to address CHITTENDEN COUNTY RPC projects from their adopted Energy Plans.

The Regional Energy Planner will be supervised by the CCRPC Planning Program Manager and work on projects with several municipalities. These projects will include those that reduce overall energy use through conservation/efficiency measures and to shift energy use from fossil fuels to renewable sources (primarily electricity and biomass). These projects will provide quantifiable benefits to communities in terms of cost savings and in terms of carbon reductions. The Vermont Home Energy Profile is a free, voluntary assessment tool that draws from publicly available data sources and homeowner inputs to provide valuable energy performance information to potential buyers in an energy profile. The Vermont Home Energy Profile allows homebuyers and sellers to assess a home's energy performance and to factor it into the valuation of a home.

Vermont Home Energy Profiles aren't just for homebuyers. For current owners, the Vermont Home Energy Profile can also be a handy way to decide where to prioritize improvements to make their home more efficient, less costly to operate, and more appealing to energyconscious buyers when the time comes to list their home.
