# 20 Organizations Call on Congress to Pass the "Climate Test" to Meet the Moment for Bold Climate Action



Earlier this week, 20 national environmental, public health, and climate advocacy organizations called on Congress to pass the "Climate Test": advancing the Build Back Better Act to put the country on a clear path to cutting planet-warming pollution in half by 2030.

The message to Congress clearly lays out the investments that must be included to achieve this science-backed goal,

while also creating good-paying jobs, reducing costs for families, and building a more equitable clean energy economy. Anything less doesn't pass the test.

# Bill McKibben Launches 'Third Act' to Rally Older Americans Around Climate Change



It's time for Baby Boomers and members of the Silent Generation to organize against climate change, according to veteran environmental activist and writer Bill McKibben. That's why he is launching a new initiative called 'Third Act' aimed at engaging activists over age 60.

McKibben, who is 60 years old himself, said he's become convinced that his generation should more actively join the climate movement, following in the footsteps of a galvanized youth. He noted that Americans his age and older have a large share of the country's financial assets and a tendency to vote in high numbers, giving them political power.

McKibben says he hopes to form local chapters of Third Act, which might be particularly relevant in Vermont, where 20% of people are age 65 or older.

McKibben announced a "very soft launch" of the organization on Twitter last week and has already had thousands of people sign up. They aim to launch the project within the next few months. If you're interested in getting involved, sign up to receive updates at the Third Act website here.

## Capstone Seeks Financial and Energy Coaching Program Team Lead



Capstone Community Action is initiating a 3-year statewide pilot program for integrating energy and financial coaching for low and moderate-income Vermonters, This

program, funded through the State of Vermont's Office of Economic Opportunity (OEO) will support 5 full time Financial and Energy Coaches who will work directly with income-eligible Vermonters to increase financial wellbeing and self-sufficiency.

Capstone is seeking to hire a statewide Financial and Energy Coaching Program Team Lead to manage the program. The Program Team Lead will be responsible for launching and overseeing the program, including: organizing staff training, program outreach and marketing, partnership building, informing senior leadership and statewide Community Action Executive Directors, and working with coaches to meet program deliverables. The Team Lead will also be a member of the Energy Savings Counseling Group and contribute to
