

Climate Impact Programs

Weatherization

- ~1,000 homes weatherized statewide through state lowincome weatherization program per year
- Prioritizing the most in need
- Comprehensive service that addresses electrical efficiency, health and safety measures, air leakage and insulation

Financial and Energy Coaching

• Aligning the mission of financial literacy with opportunities for energy saving and decarbonization

Mileage Smart

- Up to \$5K towards a used hybrid or electric vehicle
- 175 vehicles purchased through this program to date


- Rural ride hailing service, providing rides early in the morning, late at night, and weekends
