The bill will be up for its third reading vote in the Senate next week, and then will head to the House for their consideration.
 - Vermont FY23 Budget Update The Vermont House passed the FY23 budget, H.740, with unprecedented investments in climate action and resilience, which will help Vermonters reduce their energy costs, their reliance on expensive, imported and polluting fossil fuels and much more. The Budget will next head to the Senate.

Transportation in the Climate Action Plan: The Current Gap and Potential Strategies to Fill It - April 1st, 12:00 PM



Vermont's initial, adopted Climate Action Plan (CAP) lacks a significant carbon-cutting policy or regulatory tool in the transportation sector – 40% of Vermont's greenhouse gas emissions – because of the last-minute cratering of the regional Transportation & Climate Initiative program. The Cross-Sector Mitigation Subcommittee of the Vermont Climate Council is back to work to identify strategies to make

certain, stepped, equitable progress in the transportation sector at the pace legally required by the Global Warming Solutions Act.

Join members of the Vermont Climate Council by Zoom for the first public forum on this topic April 1, Noon-1:30 p.m.

This webinar is intended to articulate what we expect the current policies in the CAP will mean for reductions in the transportation sector and the gap we need to fill to meet our emission reductions requirements, particularly in 2025 and 2030. The Council is tasked with adopting recommendations in the transportation space this fall and those recommendations must be informed by robust public and stakeholder input and an in-depth technical analysis of potential options.
