- UN Sounds Dire Warning on Climate Change The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change's (IPCC) latest report, "Is a dire warning about the consequences of inaction," said Hoesung Lee, Chair of the IPCC. "It shows that climate change is a grave and mounting threat to our wellbeing and a healthy planet. Our actions today will shape how people adapt and nature responds to increasing climate risks." - **Bill McKibben on Russia's fossil-fueled aggression** In the latest Vermont Conversation, Bill McKibben talks about the confluence of war and climate change, and ways to confront both urgent crises. "If you want to stand with the brave people of Ukraine, you need to find a way to stand against oil and gas," McKibben says. Listen here. - Get an Update on Important Climate Bills Moving Through the Legislature - Watch VNRC's latest Climate Dispatch, a special edition that streamed live from the State House, for a quick update on several must-pass climate priorities from some of the advocates that have been working hard to make major strides on climate this legislative session.
- Vermont Gas Utility Offers New Service to Help Electrify Customers' Homes - Vermont Gas Systems (VGS) announced that it would begin selling, leasing, installing and servicing electric heat pump water heaters for customers in a move that it expects to be neutral to its bottom line. - Norwich Solar Develops 2.2 Megawatt Solar Project in St. Johnsbury - Norwich Solar announced the completion of a 2.2 megawatt solar project in St. Johnsbury, VT. In just its first full year of operation, the Golden Solar project is expected to offset approximately 3,795,000 kilowatt hours of electricity that otherwise would have come from fossil fuel power plants.
