The Legislature crafted and Governor Scott recently signed the FY23 budget, with over \$200 million in climate priorities, including investments in weatherization services for low- and moderate-income Vermonters, help to ready homes and our state's grid for electrification, investments in our climate workforce, cost- and carbon-cutting aid to municipalities, electric and high efficiency vehicle incentives, electric vehicle charging infrastructure, expanded public transit, micro-transit and bike and pedestrian infrastructure – and more! Weathersfield Uses Town Garage Land to Host Community Solar Array –

Weathersfield has welcomed solar electric generation by hosting a 500 kW AC solar array at the Town Garage, offsetting nearly 750 tons of CO2 emissions annually and saving the Town more than \$100,000 off its electric bills over the life of the project.
