Accessible Electric Vehicle Public Engagement Events with the Vermont Agency of Natural

Resources – Transportation is the single largest contributor to climate pollution in Vermont, and cleaning up our transportation sector to meet our state's climate requirements will mean, in part, increasing access to zero-emission vehicles. Fortunately, we have an opportunity to make these clean options much more accessible thanks to new rules that Vermont is poised to adopt this December.

Advanced Clean Cars II and Advanced Clean Trucks are the logical next steps in delivering Vermont clean, more efficient



vehicles for years to come – and every voice of support will matter in bringing these rules across the finish line. These rules are essential; they will set the foundation for Vermonters and Vermont businesses to access more clean, cost-effective vehicles – putting the onus on the manufacturers to deliver these options every year.

Throughout the month of September, the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources will be hosting a series of public engagement events around the state. Come learn about the benefits and impacts of the rules, find information about existing programs and resources to support the transition to EVs, and importantly, participate in a discussion about what policies are needed to ensure all Vermonters can benefit. The Inflation Reduction Act Delivers Affordable Clean Energy for Vermont — Congress recently passed the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), and it is the most significant legislation in U.S. history to tackle the climate crisis and strengthen our national energy security. The IRA will lower energy costs for households and businesses, providing expanded incentives and rebates for energy efficiency, electric vehicles, funding for rural electric cooperatives, workforce development dollars to support increased clean energy generation and storage, and more.

Department of Energy – Community Geothermal Heating and Cooling Design and Deployment Funding Opportunity Announcement – The U.S. Department of Energy recently announced the Community Geothermal Heating and Cooling Design and Deployment Funding Opportunity Announcement, which will award \$300,000–\$13 million for projects that help communities design and deploy geothermal district heating and cooling systems, create related workforce training, and identify and address environmental justice concerns. The funding will support the formation of community coalitions that will develop, design, and install community geothermal heating and cooling systems that supply at least 25% of the heating and cooling load in communities. Applications are due October 11, 2022. Find more information here.

Green Energy Times: VNRC & Partners: Vermont's Opportunity to Ensure

Accessible Electric Vehicles – for Consumers and Climate – "With gas prices yet again making it hard for Vermonters to make ends meet, more Vermonters are clamoring for more affordable, efficient and electric vehicles, and the rules are essential to meeting that growing

demand. And, given that transportation in Vermont accounts for about 40% of the greenhouse gas emissions we collectively generate in this state, the rules are also fundamental to substantially reducing climate pollution and creating a more resilient, equitable and clean transportation system in our rural state." Brattleboro Reformer: Transitioning to renewables while protecting vulnerable communities — "We can't get to zero carbon without building transmission to connect remote renewables with customers," said Janet Gail Besser, who leads the Smart Electric Power Alliance's Regulatory and Business Innovation program. "Sure, we can get to carbon free no problem ... as long as we build transmission, billions of dollars of transmission." Besser said New England is particularly well positioned to transition to carbon free energy resources, "But there's a lot of work to be done to make that happen." Read more here.

Bennington Banner: Peter Sterling: The Inflation Reduction Act shattered the ceiling for clean energy in Vermont — "We are finally looking at a future where renewable energy and other pro-climate technologies will benefit from a level of government support comparable to what the fossil fuel and nuclear industries have received for decades. For the first time, there will be an energy storage tax credit, a comprehensive electric vehicle tax credit, a long-term commitment to a solar tax credit for homeowners, and extra incentives for renewable energy businesses that pay prevailing wages and help to build solar equipment in the U.S." Read more here.

Williston Observer: Hinesburg community solar project seeks investors — A community-owned solar project in Hinesburg, under development by the Acorn Renewable Energy Co-op of Middlebury, is ready to start offering public shares. The 150-kilowatt solar array will be located on the capped former municipal landfill located at 179 Observatory Rd. Residents will need an electric meter in the Vermont Electric Cooperative (VEC) service territory to be eligible. Shareholders will receive the project's net metered credits on their VEC bills, and ultimately take ownership of the project. Read more here.
