2023 Legislative Session Kicks Off! - The 2023 legislative session has begun! The Vermont Council on Rural Development (VCRD) Announces Selected Communities for Their 2023 Climate Economy Resilient Communities Program! - This year's community projects include the following:

- Working with the Arlington Town Energy Committee on their Greenhouse Gas (GHG) tracking for the town and compiling available data tracking resources for other towns, including articulating and documenting the need, limitations, and process for energy tracking
- Supporting Lyndonville in a community engagement plan, process, and implementation to move the needle on energy awareness, efficiency, and interest within the community

Button Up Vermont (Wrap Up!) - This year's Button Up Vermont campaign saw the highest engagement and interest in Buttoning Up yet thanks to collaboration from over 30 partners, including communities around the state, utilities, RPCs, nonprofits, and a brand new media campaign. Some of the highlights from this year's campaign include:

VT Digger: New program helps Vermonters avoid high upfront cost of home weatherization - The Weatherization Repayment Assistance Program (WRAP) provides an option for Vermonters to finance qualifying projects such as insulating, air sealing, installing heat pumps, and advanced wood heating systems on their utility bill - payments can run as low as \$15-20 per month. So far, the program will be offered by Green Mountain Power, Ludlow Electric, Vermont Electric Cooperative, Vermont Gas, and Burlington Electric. <u>Read the full article here.</u>

VT Digger: Lawmakers plan to resurrect the clean heat standard as the 'Affordable Heating Act' - Last year's Clean Heat Standard, which Governor Phil Scott vetoed, is being reintroduced as the Affordable Heat Act. The Clean Heat Standard was designed to gradually transition heating and cooling away from fossil fuels using a credit system. Businesses, organizations, and, in some instances, homeowners would have been rewarded for helping reduce fossil fuel usage. "The skeleton of last year's clean heat standard is likely to remain under consideration in this year's bill, with lawmakers looking to refine the details and address concerns raised last session." Chase Whiting, a staff attorney at the Conservation law Foundation, celebrates that "a well-designed clean heat standard or affordable heating act could be really game-changing for Vermont based on looking at the

affordability of access to clean heating options, based on reducing climate pollution, based on reducing toxic air pollution as well." <u>Read the full article here.</u>

The Guardian: The century of climate migration: why we need to plan for the great

upheaval - This article explores how "human movement on a scale never before seen will dominate this century" and "how humanely we treat each other as we migrate, will be key to whether this century of upheaval proceeds smoothly or with violent conflict and unnecessary deaths." The UN International Organization for Migration has projected that up to 1.2 billion people will be environmental migrants by 2050 and 1.4 billion by 2060, with this number soaring with every degree of temperature increase. There are currently more people displaced by climate disasters (~50 million) than political persecution, and Climate Central projects that half a million existing US homes will be on land that floods at least once a year by 2050. <u>Read the full article here.</u>

Waterbury Roundabout: A Vermont solution to fighting climate change: 100%

renewable energy - Peter Sterling, executive director of Renewable Energy Vermont, advocates for updating our Renewable Energy Standard to get Vermont to 100% renewable energy by directing our utilities to purchase electricity from new, in-state generated wind, solar, and hydropower. The cost of solar power installation has decreased over the last decade, and the Inflation Reduction Act "has given Vermont a once-in-a-generation chance to get hundreds of millions of dollars in federal money over the next decade to make the transition to renewables even more affordable." <u>Read the full article here.</u>



NetZero Montpellier: WindowDressers helps 40 local families save energy this winter -This year, WindowDressers built 258 window inserts over a week for 40 households from Montpelier, Barre City, Barre Town, Worcester, Websterville, Graniteville, East Montpelier, and Berlin. "The Central Vermont team was able to provide ten low-income households with free windows thanks to a grant from the New England Grassroots Environmental Fund." Along with keeping homes warm during cold Vermont winters, "in a typical house, ten inserts save an average of 105 gallons of heating fuel every year for an estimated savings of \$270 per year. The inserts generally pay for themselves in less than two heating seasons." <u>Read the full article here.</u>
