Electric Vehicles and Equity - June 6, 1 pm - Can electric vehicles play a role in advancing equity in underserved and historically marginalized communities? A new blog series by Clean Energy Group explores this question in four parts. The series begins with an overview of electric vehicle costs, performance characteristics, and environmental and health impacts, then considers possible pathways for electric vehicles to deliver tangible benefits to communities, including electric school buses and harnessing energy stored in electric vehicle batteries to power critical services in an emergency. Powering Affordable Clean Energy (PACE) Program - Application Opens June 30 - As part of the Inflation Reduction Act, the USDA Rural Development's Rural Utilities Service (RUS) will forgive up to 60 percent of loans for renewable energy projects that use wind, solar, hydropower, geothermal, or biomass, as well as for renewable energy storage projects. Learn more here.



Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) Launches \$8.8 Million Program for Local Governments - The US Department of Energy's EECBG Competitive Program is an exciting opportunity for smaller communities to access funds for clean energy. Priority will be given to applicants from states with populations of fewer than two million people, team-based applications, and proposed projects that will result in significant energy efficiency improvements and fossil fuel reduction in disadvantaged communities. Health Equity and Community Design Technical Assistance (TA) Pilot Program - The Vermont Department of Health is partnering with the Vermont Department of Housing and Community Development to implement a Health Equity and Community Design TA Pilot. The pilot is seeking applications for communities to receive extra capacity and resources to develop healthy community design and placemaking plans, ideas, and projects, that center on equity in the built environment. VT Digger: Housing meets climate: Officials laud new microgrid community in South Burlington - "The forthcoming housing development will feature 155 new all-electric dwellings — a mix of single-family, multi-family and permanently affordable homes — some of which are slated to be ready for move-in later this year. Featuring rooftop solar panels, in-home Tesla Powerwall batteries for storage, onsite utility-scale battery storage, induction stoves, electric vehicle chargers and interconnected smart electrical panels, the neighborhood will form its own microgrid, which can provide electricity independently as needed." <u>Read the full article here.</u>
