

The Energy Action Network's 2023 Progress Report for Vermont is Released! Each year, the <u>EAN's Annual Progress Report</u> for Vermont provides an analysis of where Vermont stands on its climate commitments and energy goals. This year's report builds on foundational research and analysis to date, with new information, graphs, and charts that continue, unfortunately, to show that there is far more work to be done.
