Thermal Energy Network Toolkit

To build a sustainable energy future, we need a diverse portfolio of solutions. Harnessing, moving, and sharing the heat we already have in Thermal Energy Networks (TENs) can help us decarbonize our buildings more efficiently, equitably, and affordably. Climate Catalysts Leadership Program

The Vermont Council on Rural Development (VCRD) is now accepting applications for the next round of Climate Catalysts Leaders. This year the cohort will focus on new and emerging leaders from a variety of large and small communities who care deeply and want to take community action to reduce energy use and lessen climate impacts in their communities. Community Capacity Building Mini-Grants Deadline May 31st

These grants fund municipal efforts for capacity building and active participation in energy resilience initiatives, specific to MERP and beyond. Municipalities may conduct community education and outreach regarding Vermont's climate policies and incentives to cut energy costs, lower greenhouse gas emissions, and improve energy resilience in municipally owned buildings. These grants can also be used to identify potential candidate buildings for MERP's free Energy Resilience Assessments and Implementation Grants of up to \$500,000. The MERP mini-grants close May 31st so don't delay, apply today!

Communities Sparking Investment in Transformative Energy (CSITE)


DOE's Office of State and Community Energy Programs (SCEP) has released FOA-0003229: Communities Sparking Investment in Transformative Energy (CSITE). This FOA supports the administration goals by supporting programs and projects at the local level that reduce energy use and greenhouse gas emissions, save customers money, create local jobs, improve air quality, combat climate change, and focus benefits on disadvantaged communities.

This funding opportunity provides an anticipated \$18 million for local governments and federally recognized Indian Tribes to implement municipally- or Tribal-led high-impact clean energy projects in disadvantaged communities, energy communities, small- and medium-sized jurisdictions, and Tribal communities. DOE retains the right to make partial awards and to reallocate funds in the event of under subscription, ineligibility, and/or increased program funds.

The Prime Applicant must be local governments or Tribal governments representing ANY of the following kinds of communities: 1. Disadvantaged communities 2. Energy communities 3. Small- and medium-sized jurisdictions. **No Concept Paper:** This FOA is

open directly to full application which is due on 5/31/2024. To apply to this FOA, applicants must register with and submit application materials through Infrastructure Exchange at https://infrastructure-exchange.energy.gov/Default.aspx, SCEP's online application portal.

VECAN Webinar: Weatherization Repayment Assistance Program


